Gender equity and inclusivity have become crucial issues in today's society. Amrita Sai Institute of Science and Technology (ASIST), a leading institution in the field of technical education, has taken significant strides towards promoting gender equity over the past five years.

These measures aimed to ensure that female students, faculty, and staff felt secure and confident in their surroundings.

ASIST constituted Women Empowerment and Grievances Cell headed by the convener and represented by faculty and students from all the departments to address any related issues.



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It is ensured that minimum one women faculty travels in every college bus to ascertain safe travel for the girl students.

To encourage female students, ASIST implemented various initiatives. These included establishing Special Prizes for girl students at Annual Day function and financial assistance programs especially for female students. The Institution creates awareness to all the girl students to apply for AICTE PRAGATI SCHOLARSHIP introduced for the benefit of girl students by the Government.

ASIST remains committed to continues thriving for gender equity, actively engaging stakeholders, and implementing further measures to create an environment where all individual scan thrive regardless of their gender.

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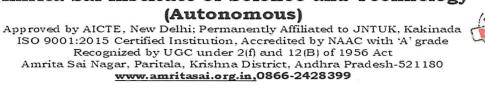
Name of the Event: Women's day celebrations

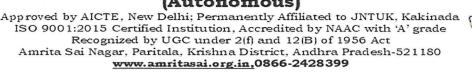

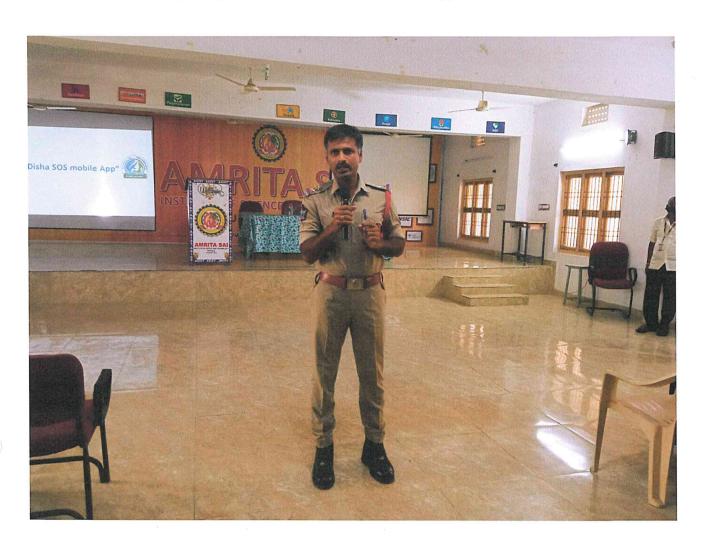

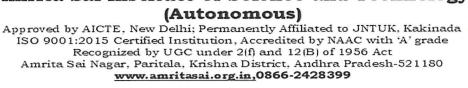
Name of the Seminar: Awareness on DISHA App

A seminar "Awareness on DISHA App" was conducted for all the Girls B. Tech students on 06/02/2023. The Inspector given the detail information on the app how to use it.



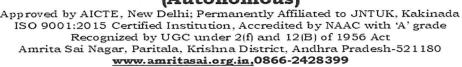

Girl Students attended for the DISHA App Seminar

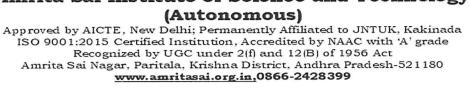


Name of the Event : Cyber Crimes and Women Protection
